360 Degree Underwriting dac respects and protects your privacy and collects, processes and controls your personal information in accordance with this Privacy Notice and in compliance with the Data Protection Acts and General Data Protection Regulation. We only ask for information that is relevant and we only keep data for specified, explicit and lawful purposes. This privacy notice sets out how we collect, use and disclose personal and sensitive data.

The following principles are adopted in processing of personal data:

- a) we process data lawfully, fairly and in a transparent manner
- b) we collect data for our specified, explicit and legitimate purposes only
- c) we only process data that is adequate, relevant and limited to what is necessary for the purposes for which the personal data is processed
